Dear Church,

Picture a healthy, tall oak tree covered in leaves with birds nesting in it. If you were to cut off a branch, it would wither and die. Not so with the branches that remain connected to the healthy tree; they thrive and flourish just like the tree itself.

The analogy of the oak tree and branches reminds us of the powerful image of the vine and branches Jesus gave us in the John 15 passage above. The Lord's warning is clear—"you can do nothing without me."

The power connection is absolutely necessary. While it may sound like a noble idea, we are not called to go solo in attempting Kingdom work for His glory. Rather we are called to develop a moment-by-moment dependence upon His Spirit flowing into us and through us to those we encounter on the journey. It is only when we are connected to Christ that opportunities and blessings we cannot imagine in our own strength become available to us. Rather than being limited by our own capacity and strength, we have His power available to us.

Every person called by the Lord is equipped by the Lord. We are indeed His workmanship and He has created us for the good works He has specifically prepared for us. Just as He called and equipped Moses and Joshua and many others we read about in Scripture, He has done the same for us.

The Lord's power is like that towering oak tree. That means we can let go of our personal expectations and self-sufficiency. The life He has prepared for us goes far beyond anything we can imagine or achieve on our own. And the best part? He is forever with us and we can remain connected to Him in every moment of our lives. It is in our best interest to have our focus fixed on the Lord. He is life.
